Call for applications for financial aid for international students with foreign citizenship and foreign qualifications, enrolled in first and second level Degree Programs at the University of Turin for the 2025-26 academic year, coming from countries affected by armed conflict in the last 12 months

PLEASE NOTE:

The present English version is provided just for information purposes. In the case of conflicting meanings between language versions, the Italian version prevails.

Application Deadline: 12:00 PM (noon) on January 23, 2026

Art. 1 - Purpose of the Call

The University of Turin is launching a series of initiatives aimed at ensuring the right to education for international students with foreign citizenship and qualifications, who are enrolled in first and second-level degree programs for the 2025-2026 academic year. These students must come from countries that have been affected by armed conflict in the past 12 months and be experiencing significant financial hardship as a result of the conflict.

For students meeting the criteria outlined in Article 2 below, the University is offering financial assistance in the form of:

- Exemption from the payment of the yearly all-inclusive enrollment fee for the 2025-2026 academic year, with the possibility of reimbursement for any installments already paid.
- Scholarships totaling a maximum of €80,000 (including IRAP and other statutory charges), with individual scholarships up to a maximum of €2,000 (also including IRAP and other charges), subject to proportional reductions if the number of applications exceeds the available funds. A minimum contribution of €500 will be guaranteed per scholarship recipient (including IRAP and other charges).

The total number of grants and the exact amounts will be determined based on the number of eligible applicants identified by the Selection Committee mentioned in Article 4.

These measures are intended for students facing severe financial hardship due to conflicts in their home countries and are designed to ensure that available

resources are allocated only to those with an actual need.

Art. 2 - Target group and eligibility criteria

The call for applications is open to applicants who, as a result of armed conflict in their countries of origin, are experiencing serious financial hardship that prevents them from continuing their university studies, and who meet the following requirements by the application deadline:

- They are international students who hold foreign citizenship and a foreign qualification valid for university admission, and who come from countries affected by armed conflict within the last 12 months.
- They are enrolled, for the 2025-2026 academic year, in any first- or second-cycle degree programme at the University of Turin.

To be eligible, students must have completed their enrollment for the 2025-2026 academic year by January 16, 2026 (no "under condition" enrollment allowed).

Applications that do not clearly demonstrate the financial hardship caused by the situation in the applicant's country of origin will not be accepted.

Students are not eligible if they are receiving:

- Other scholarships from the University of Turin or other Italian or foreign public institutions.
- Study grants from the Regional Authority for the Right to University Education in Piedmont (EDISU).
- Research grants or employment funded by the state or Italian public bodies.

Preference will be given to applicants who were eligible but not selected for other international student scholarships (IUPALS, UNICORE, students at risk) for the 2025-26 academic year.

Art. 3 - Application deadline

Applications must be submitted by 12:00 PM (noon) on January 23, 2026, via the Google Form available at the following link:

Art. 4 - Selection committee

Applications will be reviewed by the University Equitable Committee, which will be appointed in accordance with the University Equitable Committee's Regulations, established by Rector's Decree No. 10843 of November 18, 2025.

A list of eligible candidates, identified by their registration numbers, will be published on the online register and on the University Portal under: Home > Studying at uniTo > Scholarships for International Students, starting in April 2026.

Any objections regarding the list of recipients must be submitted to borse.studenti@unito.it within five days of the publication. After this period, the list will be considered final.

Art. 5 - Awarding of financial benefits

Scholarships will be awarded at the sole discretion of the Equitable Committee (*Commissione equitativa*), as outlined in Article 4.

As previously stated in Article 1, these scholarships are aimed at international students with foreign citizenship and qualifications, enrolled in the 2025-2026 academic year in first and second-level degree programs at the University of Turin, who come from countries affected by armed conflict in the past 12 months and are in financial difficulty due to such conflicts.

To ensure that funds are allocated to those in genuine need, the Equitable Committee will prioritize applicants, who are most in need of financial assistance

to continue their academic careers. Priority will be given to Students with family members or relatives in countries affected by armed conflict and Students who are in their first year of study or are enrolled for the current academic year.

Scholarships will be awarded up to a total of €80,000 (including IRAP and other statutory charges), with individual scholarships not exceeding €2,000 (including IRAP and other charges). If necessary, the amount may be reduced proportionally, but a minimum of €500 will be awarded to each eligible recipient (including IRAP and other charges).

The amount of each scholarship may be adjusted based on the applicant's financial situation, as reflected in their ISEE/ISEEU equivalent data in the University's database for the 2025-2026 academic year and/or previous years.

Scholarship recipients will also be exempt from the yearly all-inclusive enrollment fee for the 2025-2026 academic year, with any installments already paid being refunded.

In the event that insufficient funds are available to provide a scholarship of at least €500 to all eligible applicants, those who do not receive a scholarship will still be exempt from paying the yearly all-inclusive enrollment fee for the 2025-2026 academic year, with any installments already paid being refunded.

Scholarships will be paid in a single installment, starting in April 2026, to the bank account or prepaid/credit/debit card specified in the application form.

All payments must be made to a bank account or prepaid/credit/debit card that is either solely or jointly held by the student.



Art. 6 - Prohibition of cumulation and incompatibility

Scholarships cannot be combined with:

- Other scholarships from the University of Turin or other Italian or foreign public institutions.
- The scholarship awarded by the Regional Authority for the Right to University Education in Piedmont.
- Research grants or employment funded by the state or Italian public bodies.

If a candidate wins multiple scholarships, they must choose which one to accept.

For the purposes of the prohibitions and incompatibilities referred to in this article, upon acceptance of the scholarship each awardee shall submit a specific declaration in lieu of an affidavit, undertaking to notify the University promptly of any changes to the information provided as soon as such changes occur.

PRIVACY POLICY PURSUANT TO ARTICLE 13 OF THE GDPR - EU REGULATION 2016/679

The University of Turin, in compliance with Article 13 of EU Regulation 2016/679 and in accordance with Legislative Decree 101 of 2018, informs you that the personal data of candidates for this call for applications, collected through the application form or other specific methods, will be processed for institutional purposes related to this call, in line with the general principles of lawfulness, fairness, and transparency set forth by the GDPR (EU Regulation 2016/679) on the protection of personal data. The following details are provided to inform you about the nature and methods of data processing.

a) Data controller and contact information

c) Processing purpose and legal basis

The personal data requested from the data subject will be processed to carry out a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority, as defined under Article 6(1)(e) of EU Regulation 2016/679, for the purpose of processing applications related to this call.

The legal basis for processing personal data in connection with this call is Legislative Decree No. 68 of March 29, 2012, which revises the fundamental legislation on the right to education and enhances legally recognized university colleges. This is in implementation of the delegation outlined in Article 5, paragraph 1, letters a) (second sentence) and d) of Law No. 240 of December 30, 2010, and in accordance with the principles and guidelines established in paragraph 3, letter f), and

paragraph 6.

d) Types of processed data

The personal data collected and processed for the purposes mentioned above are as follows:

- Personal details (first name, last name, tax code, date of birth, nationality).
- Contact details (phone number, address, email address).

e) Data provision

Providing such data is mandatory to assess eligibility for participation in this call. Failure to provide the requested data will result in non-admission to this call and the inability to complete the application process.

f) Processing methods

Personal data will be processed using manual, computerized, and electronic tools, ensuring the security and confidentiality of the data.

The processed data may be shared with employees or collaborators in the relevant University offices who are authorized to process such data. These individuals will be adequately trained and appointed as data protection officers, system administrators, or authorized data processors.

h) Categories of data recipients

In compliance with applicable regulations, personal data will be disclosed to: Intesa Sanpaolo - the University’s bank, and other banks.

The data may be disclosed to the following categories of recipients: the Interuniversity Consortium for Automatic Computing (CINECA) for the management of student careers; the National Register of Students and Graduates; the Regional Authority for the Right to University Education for Piedmont, which manages services related to the right to education (scholarships, residences, canteens); entities providing insurance coverage for the University; other Italian and foreign universities, in the event of transfers to and from such institutions; and certifying public administrations, for the purposes of verifying substitute declarations made pursuant to Presidential Decree no. 445/2000.

The University may also disclose the personal data it holds to other public administrations where they need to process it for procedures falling within their institutional remit, as well as to any public bodies to which disclosure is mandatory—where the relevant conditions apply—under EU provisions, laws, or regulations, and to insurance companies in connection with any accident claims.

i) Data transfer to third countries

Personal data may be transferred to countries outside the European Union due to the use of Google services by the Data Controller in the educational sector.
