Assessment of qualifications, research project and interview

Qualifications to be uploaded in the on-line application

- Research project (max 7000 characters, included spaces, excluded bibliography) in English, choosing a project title among those listed and offered by the PHD programme
- Publications

When applying candidates are required to submit a file including the **Research Project** (in Italian or English, max 7000 characters, spaces included and bibliography excluded). Candidates are required to choose a research project from those offered by the PhD Programme on the web site.

Scientific excellence, feasibility during PhD programme implementation, objectives and scientific impact expected will be assessed.

The Research project should be structured as follows:

- <u>Title</u> of Research Project in Italian and English (summarizing the content of the composition).
- <u>Abstract</u> of the project in Italian and English (max 500 characters in Italian + max 500 characters in English; including spaces). This should be a short summary of the research project purposes and objectives.
- <u>State of the art</u> (max 1.000 characters including spaces). The candidate should summarise the state of the art searching in literature the most relevant references already available, focusing on the yet unanswered questions with which the research project will deal.
- -<u>Project targets</u> (max 1000 characters, including spaces). General and specific objectvies of the project, referring to the theoretical and empirical unresolved questions pointed out in the previous section.
- -Research design (max 2000 characters, including spaces). The candidate should define the empirical context and the experimental design, as well as the strategies (diversified according to their scientific domain) and the project developing phases, the procedures for the collection of data and the methodology used for data analysis.
- -<u>Expected results</u> (max 500 characters, including spaces) The candidate will explain the expected results, according to the research area and the project objectives.
- -<u>Feasibility of the project and hypothetical research</u> plan (max 1000 characters including spaces)
 The candidate will point put the resources considered as necessary for the project. They can be either competences and/or equipment, internal or external to the PhD programme and the University of Turin. The candidate is required to specify whether they are already available or will need to be activated. Please point out the timeline for each phase of the project. Where necessary, respect of
- -Innovative elements and critical points (max 500 characters including spaces)
- The candidate will explain the reasons why the project is relevant and the theoretical and practical innovative features. Limits and potential critical elements, relating to time and available resources, will also be highlighted.
- -Bibliography, should contain from 10 to 20 references.

The interview will cover the qualifications and the publications submitted by the candidate, their *curriculum vitae/studiorum*, their scientific and cultural interests and the discussion of their research project.

The interview will assess the level of knowledge of a foreign language (English/French).

The interview, on request of the candidate and duly authorised by the examining board, may be taken via Skype (art. 8 of the Call).

The activities of the PhD programme (courses, seminars, workshops) are taught both in English and Italian language. Thesis can be written and discussed in English.
