COMPETITION RULES

Divided into teams, the students will compete in a waste collection competition in a designated area near the Luigi Einaudi Campus: **in the time assigned, the participants will have to collect as much waste as possible and sort it as well as possible.**

Anyone can form a team by registering and adding other students to their team (**minimum 3 and maximum 10 in each group**). Those who do not have a team and are interested in taking part can join the '*UNITA team*' and will be placed in a mixed group.

**Maximum number of participants in the competition: 200.
Registration deadline: 8 May 2023 at 12 noon CET.**

Competition procedure

At the start of the competition, the organisers will provide the necessary equipment for collecting and sorting the waste. Each team will also receive a map of the competition area, which must be respected.

The competition lasts for two hours. At the end of the competition, 'green' prizes will be awarded to the first three teams in terms of quantity and quality of collection.

The competition will start at 14:30 in the outdoor parking lot of the Luigi Einaudi Campus, next to the Palazzina Einaudi (Corso Regina Margherita 60).

PLEASE NOTE: the starting area will also be the meeting point for any needs during the competition.

The competition ends at 16:30 in the open-air car park of the Luigi Einaudi Campus, next to the Palazzina Einaudi.

All teams must meet at the meeting point (parking lot) with the collected and sorted material by 16:30.

Teams that do not arrive on time will be disqualified from the competition (the waste collected will be disposed of by the organisers and the local waste management company).

Assigning scores

At the end of the collection, **an evaluation committee** will select the best teams by awarding three different scores:

- The top 5 teams in terms of **quantity of waste** collected (based on weight) will be awarded a decreasing score from 5 points to 1 point.
- Each committee member will give each team a score from 1 to 5 based on the **quality of the waste sorted**: the overall quality score will be the average of the scores given to the team by each committee member.
- **Bonus score**: each full cigarette stub collection bag is worth +0.5 points.

The final score for each team will be the sum of the scores listed above. The three teams with the highest score win the competition.

Cautions:

- Participants **are NOT allowed to collect waste from hazardous locations or non-transportable waste**: such waste can be reported to the organisers, who will contact the authorized and equipped personnel for collection.
- During the competition, you must contact the organisers for any needs, doubts or requests.
- In case of emergency, call 112 and the organisers.
