The visiting professor needs to hold:

- in-depth experience in the field of geography; development and post-development studies and in the field of international cooperation for development; South-South cooperation (documented by publications, the coordination of research projects and activities);
- in-depth experience in analyzing development cooperation projects involving community-based organizations, indigenous people;
- in-depth experience in teaching development and post-development studies in University courses.

The above research experience in the field of development studies and international cooperation for development must be substantiated by relevant publications in international journals.
