In particular, topics related to secularization, philosophy of religion, philosophy of history, and anthropology (philosophical and phenomenological) will be examined.

- 2) To develop skills in the field of critical thinking;
- 3) Provide knowledge related to the main problems of secularization;
- 4) To provide knowledge related to the central thematic nodes of the philosophy of history.

The visiting professor will participate in seminars and research activities with the scientific disciplinary area and department members. Other activities that may be planned include workshops with students and participation through guest lectures in the teaching activities of colleagues.
