COURSE SUMMARY

The course aims at introducing to the study of material culture as a tool for understanding first century Judaism. The course comprises of two section. The first will be dedicated to those elements of material culture that are characteristic of the Jewish presence in the Land of Israel, in particular pertaining to the religious practice: Temple, synagogues, scrolls, ritual baths, stone vessels, etc. The second, and main, section will focus on Qumran and the Dead Sea Scrolls. The study of the scrolls as archaeological materials and of the context in which they were found offers an important contribution to the understanding of the discoveries in the Desert of Judah.
