COURSE SUMMARY

This course examines the profound transformations that swept across Arab constitutional and governance structures in the aftermath of the events of 2011. The course critically examines the promises, challenges, and complexities faced by Arab countries as they grappled with constitutional reform, revolutions, and political upheavals during this pivotal period.

From the Arab Spring movements to subsequent constitutional amendments and rewriting processes, participants will analyze the multifaceted dimensions of constitutional change within the Arab world, including the challenges inherent in reconciling cultural, religious, and political diversities within constitutional frameworks.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Through this course students will gain insights into the evolving dynamics of Arab constitutionalism. The learning objectives are focussed on the ability to analyze the constitutional structures of the

Arab countries in comparative perspective and the socio-legal settings of the movements leading to constitutional change and reforms.
