COURSE SUMMARY

The course will investigate the Works of Art in the Public Space starting from the Renaissance, to front and study the problems raised by their presence: religious and political adherence (the statue of the Prince or the Virgin), the ancient and modern iconoclasms, the compromises and historical-artistic adaptations.

The cycle of lessons intends to support the material turning point in historiography and the disciplinary opening that abolishes the boundaries between history, art history, ethnography, addressing some questions posed by current events (for example the so called "cancel culture").

He/she must have relevant teaching experience in the field of Art in the Public Space and fluent skills of English language.
