Paedophilia and the clergy

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

a. Students must know the problems connected to maltreatment and sexual abuse in its various forms and the wide range of meanings this phenomenon assumes in studies related to issues including separation, divorce and child custody.

They must also understand the concept of maltreatment not only from the clinical point of view but also in a judicial perspective with reference to current legislation.

- b. Students must be able to use valid, reliable methods of recognizing the phenomenon and of assessing its psychological effects so as to enable appropriate reparative interventions to be designed for the protection of the child and the family. They must also be able to interpret and critically assess the outcome of interviews with the parents or the child, of observation sessions or psychological tests used in assessment, and of the expert opinions obtained, being fully aware of the ethical responsibilities.
