COURSE SUMMARY

The lessons are meant as a part of a course addressed to post-graduate students and focused on what is known as "civic culture" in Italian communes and municipalities from 12th to 14th century. Through a significant variety of sources, direct expression of so called "pragmatic writings and literacy" of the communal institutions, the course is meant to analyze the transition to a new political language and literacy and, at the same time, the change of normative orders as a social and cultural construction, produced and transformed in a continuous process by a multitude of actors (both lay and religious).

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

The learning objectives of the lessons are:

- analyzing the process of transformation of urban "civic culture" of Italian towns from 12 to 14th century;

- reconstructing an historical regime of knowledge production and the functionality of some specific media therein;

- understanding the changing of political language through the analysis of institutional sources, such as public record office documents (charters and registers), chronicles, and normative literature.
