COURSE SUMMARY

The "Economy and Society in Contemporary China" course builds on other courses within the China & Global Studies concentration offered by the Corso di Laurea Magistrale in Scienze Internazionali, with the aim of providing disciplinary knowledge and skills for the study of China's political, social and economic development, in particular 1949-today.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

- Analyze major socio-anthropological theories and concepts relevant to the study of China's economic and social transformations
- Critically evaluate how global capitalism, socialism, and neoliberalism intersect in the Chinese context
- Trace the historical evolution of China's economic reforms from the Maoist era to today
- Understand the role of state policies and political institutions in shaping contemporary Chinese society

- Explore the dynamics of China's transition from a planned economy to a market-oriented system
- Investigate the impact of globalization, industrialization, and urbanization on various social groups
- Evaluate ethnographic research and case studies on contemporary Chinese society
- Analyze state-society relations and the role of civil society in addressing social concerns
- Communicate complex ideas effectively through written assignments and presentations, including for a Chinese academic audience (in preparation for dissertation in Double Degrees).

The Visiting Professor will hold a Lunch Seminar at the Dipartimento CPS and will collaborate with Dr. Andornino in the promotion of contemporary China literacy in the Corso di Laurea in Scienze Internazionali, dello Sviluppo e della Cooperazione (SISCO)
