The University of Turin promotes the right to study in order to guarantee everyone the opportunity to continue their studies, ensuring various forms of economic support to meet the costs of university education, several types of total or partial exemption from the payment of student contributions, and opportunities for concessions and discounts for sustainable mobility, health and sport, culture and leisure.

If you attend the central locations, or those activated in Alba, Aosta, Asti, Biella, Cuneo, Ivrea and Savigliano, we have prepared some useful information for you to make the most of this new adventure!

In this kit you will find the main opportunities in terms of right to study available to those studying at UniTo.

Grants, awards and contributions

- <u>Scholarships</u> awarded by the University or external organisations and companies.
- <u>Scholarships for international students</u> to support international students, including those from countries at risk.
- <u>Dual Career</u> scholarships for student-athletes: scholarships dedicated to student-athletes included in the University's Dual Career programme, designed to support top-level athletes in reconciling their competitive sporting commitments with their university careers..
- <u>Study prizes</u> awarded by the University or external organisations and companies for results achieved during the university career (theses, research projects, etc.).
- MUR contributions Fondo per il sostegno dei giovani Classi STEM (information under 'Other initiatives and contributions for the right to study'): ministerial contributions for students enrolled in STEM degree classes who meet specific merit requirements.

• <u>Part-time collaborations</u>: allow students who meet specific merit requirements to carry out paid collaboration activities at the University's facilities up to a limit of 200 hours per academic year.

Other initiatives for the right to study

- Reimbursement of season tickets: UniTo supports the right to study and sustainable mobility with a new initiative dedicated to the partial reimbursement of the cost of purchasing annual or multi-month season tickets for local public transport services.
- Getting around with UniTo: the University conventions
 for sharing mobility. The entire university community can
 benefit from discounts and concessions to use shared
 means of transport such as bicycles, scooters and electric
 scooters and shared cars for their journeys.
- Housing subsidies (information under 'Other initiatives and subsidies for the right to study'): ministerial subsidies for housing rental expenses incurred by students offcampus (resident in a different place from the one where the rented property is located), enrolled in a course of study, doctorate course or specialisation school and with ISEEU/ISEE parity not exceeding defined values.

- <u>Torino Piemonte Museums Subscription</u>: voucher to purchase, at a subsidised price, the Abbonamento Musei Piemonte Valle d'Aosta card
- <u>University Sports Centre CUS Torino</u>: the CUS Torino University Sports Centre offers the opportunity to practise sports at competitive or amateur level at discounted rates for university students and also to take advantage of free gym hours and field rental with the FREE SPORT programme.
- <u>Centre for Preventive Medicine and Sport</u>: The Centre offers access to all services at reduced rates and rates discounted by up to 50% on numerous specialist examinations, therapies and diagnostic investigations. There are also agreements with other organisations and sports clubs.
- <u>Facilities and discounts</u>: facilities and discounts for health, sports, sustainable mobility, culture and leisure initiatives.

Student contribution exemptions and reductions

Student contribution and ISEE

The University's student contribution model provides for exemptions and reductions based on economic status, also taking into account full-time or part-time study commitment, year of enrolment and merit requirements.

You can apply for a reduction based on your UNIVERSITY ISEE or, if you are an international student, based on the per capita GDP PPP of your country of residence.

Exemptions and concessions

Numerous exemptions and concessions are available on the basis of projects and agreements, as well as measures specifically dedicated to supporting the right to study, for specific cases, e.g:

- Edisu scholarship holders.
- students with disabilities.
- international students.
- student-athletes.
- care leavers students.
- households with at least two members enrolled*.

- <u>Classrooms and study rooms</u>: find spaces where you can study alone* or in company: study rooms, library study rooms, computer rooms.
- <u>Libraries</u>: all the information on the services offered by the University libraries is available on the website of the <u>Sistema Bibliotecario di Ateneo</u> (<u>SBA</u>) and on the websites of the individual sites.
- Museums and Archives: the collections in Turin's University Museums, whose origins trace back to 1739, and the documents conserved in the University's Historical Archive, starting from 1693, represent an extraordinary heritage of cultural assets.
